Petrucci's Odhecaton Canti C Nr. 25 F 40-41 (Jay pris amours deizak) is based on the same subject, but differs mainly in the contratenor, which makes the Chansonnier Nivelle more likely to be Spinacino's source. Very similar to this are the Leuven Chansonnier (Nr. 12, different CT in m. 24), the Chansonnieres Wolfenbüttel (Nr. 29), Dijon (Nr. 1) and Laborde (Nr. 22, with a former version of the CT). Very helpful for these finding is the website: http://chansonniers.pwch.dk/index.html, an open access project.
